

CTI Referencing Guide

During the completion of assessment tasks, a student will be asked to respond to questions and complete projects that may require research.

Students are required to reference or cite the source of the information. Referencing is the process of acknowledging a source of information or text. When completing assessments students should ask themselves the following questions:

Do I need to reference?

Can you respond to the assessment in your own words, using your own thoughts and ideas? If so, then there is no need to reference or cite a source of information.

Please note: It is not acceptable for students to copy and paste the entire response and reference it, responses must be put into the students own words.

When do I need to reference?

Students who copy, access, or utilise ideas and information found on the internet, in books, libraries and other forms of literature must reference or cite the source of the information or text. It is good practice to reference as you go, do not leave it until submission.

How do I reference?

There are several referencing standards available to students, however, referencing requires persons (as a minimum) to provide the author(s) name and initials, title of the information source, publication information (volume number, issue number), page or URL details, accessed day month year.
